


Schedule pick-ups for after 9:00 pm at the earliest

- Table numbers are on the ticket.






 Arrival – Graduands are asked to arrive for 8 AM




When You Arrive...




Processional (approx. 8:50 am)




- Marshalls guide graduands towards the arena to begin the ceremony
- Please stay in your alphabetical order, this makes it easier for the photographers later
- Marshalls will guide you to your seats
- Remain standing

Proceed to the Stage

- Marshalls signal rows when it is time to stand
- Move towards the right side of stage. Look for Marshalls - they will guide you
- Adjust Gown and Stole (teachers there to help)
- Walk up stage stairs towards administrator at podium
- Tassel on right side of cap



Crossing the Stage



- Hand your assistant principal your name card
- Whisper your name in their ear if requested.
- When name is announced:
 - Move tassel to left side of cap
 - Walk towards Mr. Whitbread

The TASSEL

Right side: <u>before</u> your name is announced

Left side: <u>after</u> your name is announced.







Greet Mr Whitbread

- Put left hand out to receive red portfolio
- Shake hands with right hand
- Continue along the stage (Don't Rush!)

There are a few options:






Leaving the Stage

Leave the stage to get your graduation photo

Pick up personalized certificate from the guidance counsellors

You will be guided back to a seat by the marshals





What should I wear to "walk the stage"?



- Look your best!
- Footwear: comfortable flats or low heel, summer sandals. Preference is no runners or flip flops.
- Collared shirt with business casual or dress pant. Tie is optional.
- Summer skirt and blouse, summer dress, or pant suit.
- The gowns keep you warm seaters and suit jackets not recommended
- Don't forget your Grad Gown, and hat with tassel and Red v-stole!
- No political representations (flags, sashes, etc.) - inclusive environment

Exit Processional & Gown Return

 Marshalls will lead you out of the arena to return your gown before you exit the venue

 There is <u>not</u> time to get photos with your guests between the ceremony and gown return

Graduation is a <u>family</u> milestone that <u>can/must/should</u> be celebrated regardless of how you choose to recognize your accomplishment!



Gown, Hat, Tassel, V-Stole: Ms. Adams

The gown and vee stole that you are about to receive are rentals and must be returned immediately after the ceremony.

Please take advantage of opportunities to take pictures in your gown with your family and friends in the week PRIOR to the ceremony on May 22nd.

Gown, Hat, Tassel, V-Stole: Ms. Adams

- If gown and vee stole are damaged or not returned, you will be charged \$127.30 for the gown and \$43.85 for the vee stole.
- The graduation cap is yours to keep as a souvenir. Please do not "bedazzle" before the ceremony – exception: traditional beading.
- Please attach your tassel securely (double winding) before putting on!



Picking Up Your Graduation Gown

- You must present picture ID when picking up your gown and initial that you have picked up your gown.
- Your gown has a barcode and has been assigned to you based on your height.
- Please double check that the gown you are receiving has your name on the tag.
