Information for Junior High students



High School Diploma Requirements

- English Language Arts - 30 level (ELA 30-1 or 30-2)
- Mathematics - 20 Level (Math 20-1, 20-2 or 20-3)
- Science - 20 Level (Sci. 20, Sci. 24, Bio. 20, Chem. 20 or Phys. 20)
- Social Studies - 30 Level (SS 30-1 or SS 30-2)
- Physical Education 10
- Career and Life Management 20 (CALM) - 3 credits
- 10 credits **in any combination** from: CTS, Second Languages, Fine Arts, PE20/30
- Ten credits in any 30 level courses (in addition to 30-level English and Social)
- Additional Courses (minimum 24 credits)
- TOTAL MINIMUM CREDITS REQUIRED 100

 - English 10-1 – Academic English; 10-2 – Applied English
 - Academic English 30-1 required for University
 - Applied Level English 30-2 for College/ Technical College

- 3 Levels:
 - -1 Pre-Calculus route
 - -2 Principles route
 - -3 Apprenticeship & Workplace
- In Grade 10:
 - Math 10 C (leads to -1 or -2)
 - Math 10 – 3 (applied level)
 - Math 15 (to prepare for 10C)

Welcome to WCHS! All Grade 10 students are required to take a minimum of 40 credits or 8 courses. Students who are taking Fine Arts courses outside of the timetable will take more than this. 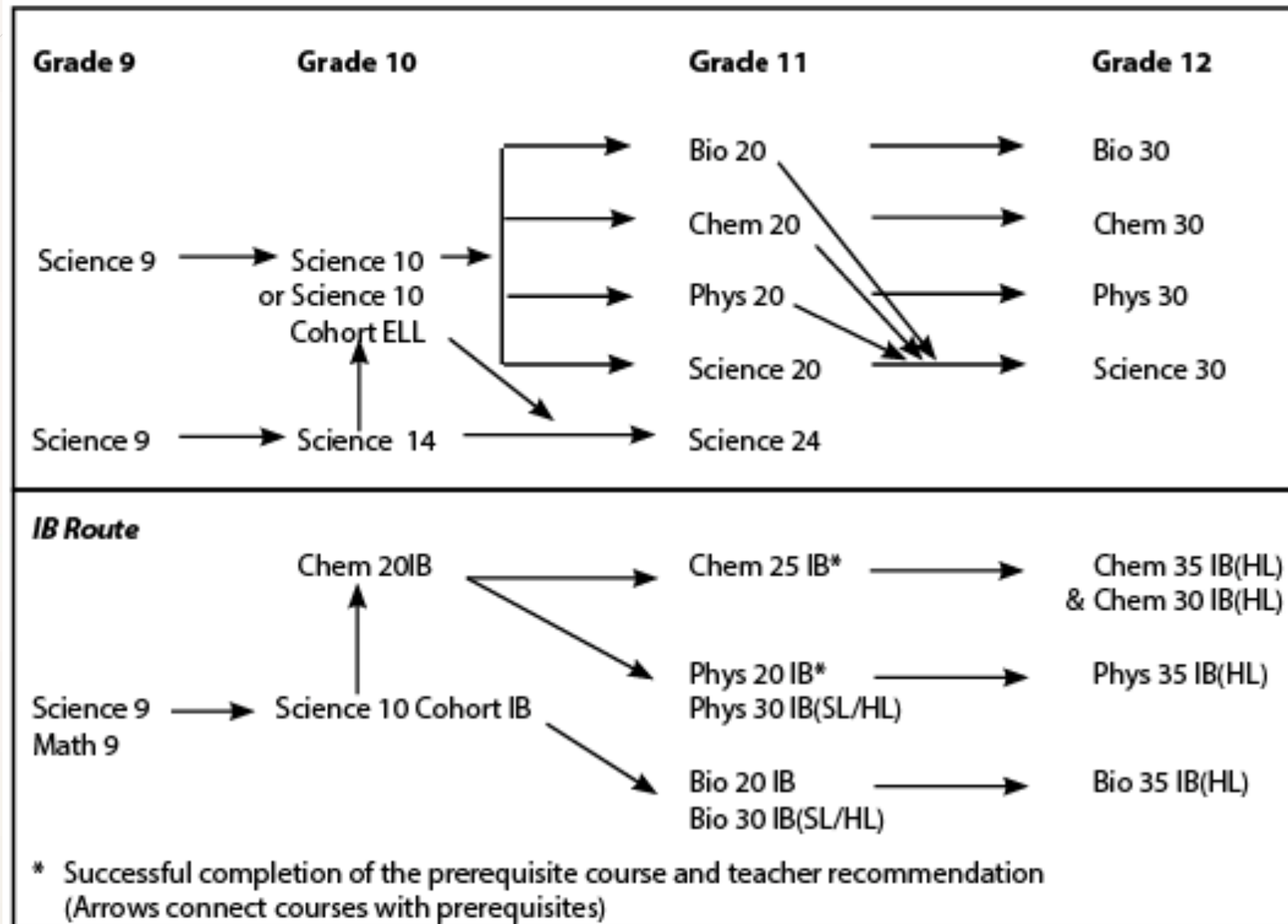
