What is Off-campus Education?









"Off-campus education uses planned education experience to enable students to acquire knowledge, skills, and attitudes related to work and other life roles through their participation in out-of-class study, observation, and/or performance at community-based work sites"









Provides pathways for:

- Career Exploration
- Exposure to career pathways
- Experiential learning opportunities
- Pursuing an area of focus or passion
- Development of workforce competencies

- RAP / Internships
- Unique Pathways
 - Exploratory Programs
 - Dual Credit
 - Green Certificate









Program 1: Work Experience

- Students may earn up to 30 credits
- 15 counted toward the Alberta High School Diploma
- Student work with an employer to develop workplace competencies.
- Students who are currently employed. G10-12
- Summer work experience program
- Pre-Req: Employed









Program 2: Internships

- Provides experience / exposure to a career pathway
- Focus on "in-demand" sectors
- Paid & Volunteer opportunities
- Summer or semester-based opportunity
- Recommended G11 or G12
- Application and interview selection mostly though CNG















Across a variety of sectors:

• ICT:

 Applications Developer, Junior software developer, Python developer, Social Media, etc.


• HEALTH:

Skilled Trades:

 Auto Service, Hairstylist/Barber, Carpenter, Cook Electrician, Plumbing and Pipe Trades













Program 3: RAP

- Students interested in a registered trade
- Summer or semester-based opportunity
- Recommended G11 or G12 starts with W. Exp.
- Hands-on applied learning occurs on the job site, under the supervision of a journeyperson.
- Students earn high school credits and apprenticeship hours
- Student requirements vary (e.g.) Drivers Lic.













Dual Credit & Exploratory Programs

- Offered through CBE Unique Pathways (UP)
- Helps support successful transition to post-secondary
- Deeper career exploration and development
- Study in an area of interest or passion
- May offers industry certification
- Some certificated programs
- Multiple start dates















Program 4: Exploratory Programs

- Learn alongside industry mentors / instructors
- Free to CBE students Grade 11 & 12 (age req)
- Hands-on development of career skills
- In-person, Interested and committed to complete
- Responsible (meet workplace expectations)
- 1-CR safety modules completed prior
- Earns work wxperience credits













Program 5: Dual Credit Programs

- In-person, online, or blended (may require timetable adjustment)
- Synchronous or asynchronous
- Unique 30-level CTS credits, Post-secondary credits & some Certifications (VTA, Pre-Employment)
- Across various occupational categories
- Post-secondary learning and expectations
- One semester up to 2 years

Work Experience Program - Unique Opportunities Registered Apprenticeship Program (R.A.P)

Program Objectives

- To explore potential careers
- . To earn high school credits
- . To learn about necessary skills required to enter the workforce
- . To gain new transferable skills from experience in the workplace
- To understand both employee and employer expectations and responsibilities
- Resumé building

Work Experience Program

Work Experience is an educational strategy NOT a job placement program.

It provides students with prerequisite job safety training and opportunities to reflect and learn from employment or volunteer positions. Students who are currently employed or volunteer, more than three hours a week may use their positions for the Work Experience program. Students not currently working or volunteering may make an appointment with our Career Practitioner to find employment or volunteer opportunities.

Credits are based on the number of hours at the worksite.

25 hours of work = 1 credit Maximum credits available = 35 credits

Unique Opportunities

We partner with a variety of businesses and non-profit organizations to offer unique opportunities that combine learning with career experiences. Unique opportunities are available to CBE high school students and are continually added throughout the year.

These learning opportunities fall into a number of different categories:

- Dual Credit
- Internships
- Exploratory Programs
- Multi-disciplinary

Registered Apprenticeship Program (R.A.P.)

The RAP is a unique program that gives students the opportunity to pursue an apprenticeship in one of over 53 Alberta designated trades while also completing their high school diploma. The goal for students is to achieve the first full year of required apprenticeship hours by graduation. Up to 40 high school credits can be earned through RAP. Students should begin this program in the summer after their Grade 10 year, although it is possible to begin the program in the summer of their Grade 11 year.
